**Fred Carlton Evans**, age 83, 216 Dahl Street, Stanley left his family and friends on January 29, 2021. He was born in Stanley, WI on December 9, 1938, to Marlowe and Dorothy (Toft) Evans. The family relocated to Sioux City, Iowa when his father began working for the Milwaukee Railroad. Fred graduated from Sioux City East High School and later earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Art Education from Morningside College in Sioux City. During his senior year, he was editor of the college yearbook. After several years of teaching in the United States, he began a 35-year career of teaching for the Department of Defense Schools across the globe. His assignments included France, Japan, Norway (his favorite), Bahrain, Crete, Philippines and Germany. He retired from DoDDs in Bonn, Germany and then worked a few more years teaching in International Schools in Germany, Cameroon, and Egypt. During the early years of his career, he earned a Master's Degree from Michigan State University in their overseas program. His career allowed for extensive travel throughout the world. Upon retirement in 1998, he returned to Stanley, which he had always loved since the many happy times he had spent with his family there in his youth. Fred purchased his grandparents' historic home at 918 N. Broadway (Moon Park), from his favorite aunt, Eleanor Toft-Eimermann. During his time in Stanley, he was a past member of the Stanley Lions Club, served on the Library Board and the City Tourism Committee. He was also an active member of the Stanley Area Historical Society and served a number of years as the organization's Vice -President and photographer, which resulted in his recording many changes in the community. Fred was an avid reader of books and periodicals and followed politics with a passion. He enjoyed playing bridge and other card and board games with his friends, both in Stanley and with his life-long friends from his DoDD teaching years, who gathered annually after retirement.

Fred is survived by his nephews Jay Evans (Natalie), Alabama, Michael Riley and David Riley of Texas, nieces Wendy Evans (Larry Glazier), Illinois and Elizabeth Riley of Texas, his cousins Sherril Garahan of Minnesota and Catherine Garahan Malavarca of New Jersey, his grand nephews and nieces Evan Malavarca, and Laura and Eliot Garahan and many friends he gained during his career and since retirement in Stanley. He is preceded in death by his parents, and brother Richard Evans and sister Janet Riley.
